God looked around and said, "Let Us gather the water all into one place."


And as God spoke it happened. The waters gathered into one place and dry land appeared.

God looked at all of this and said it was good. It was night and it was morning, and that was the third day.



Older Guys


- 1. What do you think the waters above are? Read Genesis 1:6-8.

- 3. Read Genesis 2:15-22. Write down everything you notice about the creation of Eve. What does this tell you about how God views her, and how she should be treated?




- 1. Make a creation book.
