
Moses, the Ten Commandments, and a Big Mistake Exodus 19:1-32:35

Questions

Younger Kids

- 1. What did they need to do to get ready to meet God?
- 2. What is a law about how to treat other people?
- 3. What did the people ask Aaron to make them? Did God like what they did? Why didn't he like that?
- 4. What is the most important command God gave?

Middle Kids

- Read Exodus 19:10-11. What are the Israelites to do to get ready for God? What do you do to get ready for God?
- 2. Do you think the order of the 10 Commandments is important? Why did God put them in that order?
- 3. Read Exodus 20:18. How did the Israelites react to God's presence? How do you react to God?

4. Read the section titles for Exodus 20-31. Why do you think God puts so much detail into what He tells them?

Older Guys

- 1. Read Exodus 20:1-2. What do you learn about God from these two verses? Who is He?
- 2. Read Exodus 20:3-6. What parallels can you draw between God and a spouse in this situation. Think of an idol as someone your spouse is having an affair with. How would that feel?
- 3. Read Exodus 20:12. Is this a promise?
- 4. Reread the passage from Exodus 19:12-22 and 20:18-19. Why are they so afraid? Is there good reason for it?
- 5. How does Moses react to their fear? Read Exodus 20:20. Was that the best reaction? How would you feel if you had been there?
- 6. Read Exodus 23:20-26. What promise does God give His people?
- 7. Read Exodus 32:9-15. Why does God relent?

- 8. What excuse does Aaron give? Read Exodus 32:21-24.
- 9. Read Exodus 32:31-34. Can we take another person's place for their punishment?

Activities

- 1. Get some cardstock and make a tablet shape. Copy the 10 Commandments onto it to help you remember them.
- 2. Go outside and find a small rock. Throw it on the ground as hard as you can. Were you able to chip or break the rock? Imagine how hard Moses threw down the stone tablets to break them.
